









Project Overview

Low Bank Ground Adventure Centre, situated on the picturesque shores of Coniston Water in the Lake District, is a long-established outdoor education facility used by schools and youth groups across the UK. As part of its ongoing commitment to improving access to high-quality outdoor learning, the centre undertook a comprehensive refurbishment of its existing Boat House and the construction of a new Boat Store.

Project Goals

The refurbishment project was initiated to:

- Modernise and structurally enhance the existing Boat House
- Improve accessibility, safety, and functionality for staff and visiting groups
- Provide additional secure storage for water sports equipment
- Maximise use of the lakeside location in a sustainable and sensitive manner

Scope of Works

The works included the following key elements:

Boat House Refurbishment

- Structural assessment and strengthening of the existing stone Boat House building
- Re-roofing for weather resilience and structural timber repairs for longevity
- Removal of a portion of the internal jetty to provide additional boat storage racking
- Upgrade of doors and windows to meet current security and conservation standards
- Installation of new timber piles, external jetty area, rope barriers and moorings.
- Provision of internal lighting, power supply, mezzanine stairs and handrails
- Installation of bat and bird boxes and a wild flower meadow

New Boat Store Construction

- Construction of a galvanised steel framed, storage building adjacent to the main Boat House
- Purpose-designed to accommodate paddleboards, canoes, kayaks, buoyancy aids and ancillary gear
- Environmentally sensitive materials chosen to blend with the natural surroundings including locally sourced Coniston slate and aggregates
- The very latest in solar panel, inverters and battery backup has been installed to operate general and security lighting and power

Challenges

- Working within a national park and lakeside conservation area required careful planning and coordination with the Lake District National Park Authority.
- Maintaining safe and clear access for ongoing educational programmes during construction.
- Ensuring minimal disruption to the ecology and natural character of Coniston Water.


Solutions

- A phased construction approach allowed parts of the site to remain operational throughout.
- All works were scheduled to avoid peak activity periods and sensitive wildlife seasons.
- Materials were selected for durability, low environmental impact, and visual harmony with the local vernacular and style of the boat house

Outcome

- The refurbished Boat House and new Boat Store now offer vastly improved facilities, enabling the safe and efficient delivery of water-based activities.
- Equipment is now better stored, maintained, and accessed, improving the experience for both instructors and young participants.
- The project has helped future-proof the centre's outdoor education offering while respecting the site's environmental context.
