What we donated

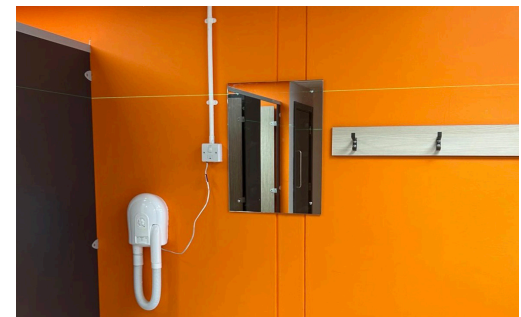
